## Editorial

I'd like to say a quick thank you to everyone for getting Vol #2 made. It's all been sent out and I hope everyone enjoys it.

The Kickstarter itself, although a success, did highlight a few thoughts I've been having in the last 6 months or so, and it cemented a decision I made before Christmas 2017. That was to slow down my workload a little, and part of that will be bringing the ongoing Sliced anthology to a stopping point.

I plan to publish digitally up to issue #12 and then do one more kickstarter to get Vol #3 into print. A trilogy of books that embodies over 3 years of work seems like a good place to draw things to a close.

I hope this choice doesn't cause too much disappointment. We've had a miraculous run. It's all gone so much further and better than I ever could have planned when I had the vague idea that I could edit an anthology. Not only that but an anthology with very limited appeal. When I look at where the project is and how it has grown I'm thrilled, but I do feel that I have failed on a few fronts. Over 2 years in, with the success we have enjoyed I did hope that we'd have tapped into a slightly larger audience. I view this as a failure because I know that there is a market for our kind of book out there, but I haven't been able to reach it. I don't have the marketing skillset, or the available time to push the project any further than I have. So, I'm happy to shoulder the responsibility for that.

I never wanted it to stop abruptly and disappear. And it won't. The 12 issues will remain online. The website will remain active as long as I can keep it going. The 3 books will be out in the world, hopefully being enjoyed and passed around a bit, and they will also eventually be on various other digital platforms like the comichaos app.

I also have vague plans on how I can keep what we've all established going in some form. As we have a good base, and I like to think we have a good reputation for doing what we do. I've viewed the last 3 years as publishing creators that might not have the opportunity to see their work published. That has been a huge plus for me. Publication in any form feels like a goal, an achievement and it drives us all on to start making that next 'thing'. It's this element of the project I want to perpetuate.

I would like to help creators make their first longer works. One-shot comics and OGN's. Still with the same experimental verve and aesthetic. Still books that might struggle to find a more regular home. I believe, at this point, I have quite an advantageous skillset for someone looking to self-publish their first book. I can help with editorial, project management, lettering, pre-press production and I know how to run a kickstarter. I'd quite like to chose 1 or 2 longer projects each year and help make them a reality through a type of 'Sliced Mentorship'.

So what does the next year hold? 3 more digital issues and a print trade. I hope you'll support us in this shift of focus, as you have in unbelievable fashion up to now. And I hope you'll relish the rest of our books as we make them the very best they can be.

In College I gave a slide presentation on my favorite artist...



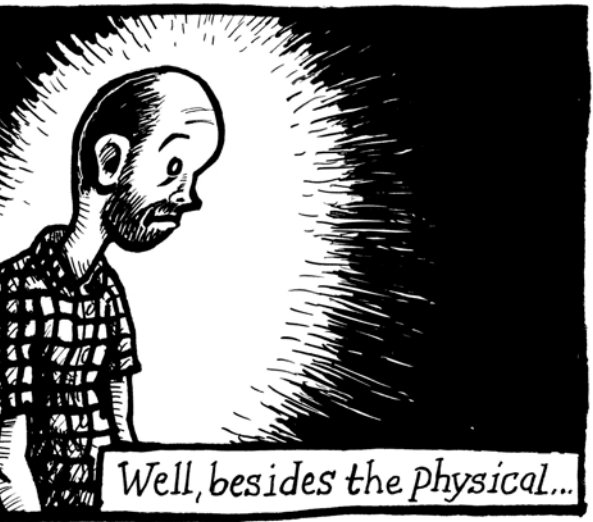
My painting teacher, someone who I respected greatly, approached me after class...
